#### 2014 Big Fish of the Year Derby - Last Call

Nice trophies will be given to the winners of the **Big Fish of the Year Derby** in the various categories at our 2015 past President's Dinner that will be held on March 24th. #### **New Chef Needed**

Bill Fish has retired from the kitchen and we need a member to prepare refreshments so that we have something to snack on at the end of the meeting. It is a nice way to end the meeting and it also give us the opportunity to sit down and chat with each other. The refreshments do not have to be very complicated, but can be up to the discretion of the chef. See John Toth to discuss this position.

### **Open Space Ballot Issue**

Voters in the last election voted to approve the Open Space ballot question, which essentially approves buying open space and the funding of other public entities (like parks) with a tax that is imposed annually on businesses called a Corporate Business Tax (CTB). The problem here is that there is a big pot of money of \$71 million, but no decision has been made as to who is going to get this money! Usually, this decision is done first, but not in the political climate we live in. Right now, it looks like several environmental groups like the Audobon Society is going to have a big say as to where this money is supposed to be allocated, and monies going to our parks, clean water programs and the Division of Fish & Wildlife will have reduced funding! Our Division of Fish & Wildlife is already underfunded and may have its operating budget reduced from \$8 million to \$5.3 million! On December 8th, there was a Senate Environment and Energy Meeting chaired by Senator Smith to hear testimony on who should get the pieces of that \$71 million pie. I testified at this hearing on behalf of the New Jersey Outdoor Alliance and the Jersey Coast Anglers Association (JCAA) that fishing is big business for our state (\$1.5 billion) and our Division of Fish & Wildlife should not have its budget reduced and this reduction will have a very negative effect on this Division that is **producing revenue** for our state through its fishing and hunting programs. After hearing testimony from various groups looking for money, one woman testified that if voters really knew what was going on with this Open Space ballot issue, they would never have voted for it! I totally agree with her! This is the first of a number of hearings that will determine where the \$71 million will go. I will be attending these future hearings. I was the only person at this hearing that representing anglers and hunters, and that is how we get shortchanged when decisions are made in Trenton when nobody is around to speak up on our behalf.

### **Update on Striped Bass by John Toth**

On December 18th, the New Jersey Outdoor Alliance (NJOA) held a caucus in Trenton with New Jersey's legislators to brief them on issues so that they better understand them and can vote intelligently on them (we hope). They received presentations from representatives of the Division of Fish & Wildlife (DFW) concerning the exploding population of deer and black bears, and the upcoming proposals concerning striped bass. Our legislators must approve striped bass regulations and this caucus gave them a "heads up" on what is coming for striped bass. Legislators have to pass this legislation ASAP so that our striped bass season can start on time and not be out of compliance in early march 2015. Our legislators also received an explanation on how the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) regulates striped bass and it has to approve the proposals coming from our DFW. There are two proposals indicated in each category listed below, **but only one of them** will receive expected approval by the ASMFC:

One striped bass at 28 inches to 42 inches, and one at 42 inches and above (2 fish)

One striped bass at 29 inches to 36 inches, and one striped bass at 36 inches and above (2 fish)

#### Striped Bass Bonus Program

One striped bass at 28 inches and above - or one striped bass 24 inches to 28 or 29 inches.

**Bottom Line -** In the above scenarios, anglers will be able to catch **2 striped bass**, and also be eligible to catch an additional striped bass under the **Bonus Tag Program - 3 fish in total**.

I will not go into the timelines for implementation and will keep you continually updated on how our striped bass season unfolds for 2015. (As a footnote, this NJOA caucus was well attended by anglers and hunters (including myself, Serge Radossi and others) and if sportsmen did not show up in Trenton why should legislators care about those issues that are important to us).


#### February 19 - 22nd - New Jersey Boat Show



**2014 Big Fish Contest Rules:** To limit confusion about the rules governing our Big Fish Contest, our Board members discussed this issue and agreed to the following provisions that would take into effect for 2014 and in the future:

- 1. Fish have to be in season to be entered.
- 2. The fish can be caught anywhere, not in just New Jersey's waters.
- 3. The fish entered has to be verified by the boat captain or another club member or at an official weigh station. A picture of the fish is a much-preferred way to verify an entry into the Big Fish contest done by a cell phone or a regular camera. A club member can win more than one Big Fish contest prize.
- 4. Dues card number must be on the submitted application (Dues number can be obtained from our Membership Secretary)
- 5. Affidavits must be received within 30 days after the fish is caught. Entries for fish caught after 12/15 of a given year must be received by Janaury15th of the following year.
- 6. Any member submitting a false affidavit will be disqualified from entering the contest during the year. If disqualified twice, the member will be expelled from the club.
